What is Team of Concern?

Team of Concern provides free preventative education to youth, families, and teachers at Ladue Middle and Senior High and offers free supportive services to at-risk students.

What is required to receive services?

Applicable students must be current students at Ladue Middle or Senior High Schools.

How can a youth receive help?

Anyone can refer a student – a friend, a family member, a teacher, or the student him or herself. What happens after a youth is referred?

Information about the youth's situation is gathered and assessed to make sure the Team of Concern program will be beneficial to the individual. Youth accepted in the Team of Concern program will work one-on-one with the school teams coordinator and counselor through Preferred Family Healthcare.

At-Risk Behaviors May Include:

- Changes in mood
- Loss of interest in usual activities
- Drop in academic performance
- Red, sagging, or glazed eyes
- Unusual smells on breath, clothing, or belongings
- Withdraw or isolation
- Changes in peer group
- Secretive or suspicious behavior
- Unexplained weight loss or gain
- Excessive need for privacy
- Unusual behaviors
- Use of drug related slang terms
